



Agricultural based rural economy

Total area: 86,600 km2 20 % of land territory occupied by Armenian military troops

Borders with:

Russia, Turkey, Georgia, Ira Armenia, Caspian Sea

Population: 9 mln

Climate: warm dry, semi desert climate. Warm long summers, short cold winters

Agriculture: only with irrigation

Landowners: 864,500

Farmers' Problems following privatisation

- Cut off from production subsidies
- Break away of traditional market outlets
- Low prices for agricultural products
- Rising costs of farm inputs
- Outdated irrigation network
- Agricultural equipment insufficient, poor quality, high maintenance and operations costs, spare parts are lacking
- •Saline, polluted and impoverished soils
- Limited knowledge of new owners










Agro Information Centre (Agro Informasiya Merkezi – AIM)

- AIM is a local Non-Governmental Organization
- AIM aims at improving the livelihood of rural population via delivering demand driven extension services and introducing sustainable farming systems
- AIM pioneered the demand-driven village based extension services in Azerbaijan

AIM:

- Founded in 1999
- 35 staff members in 4 regional offices
- 45 projects in 27 districts of Azerbaijan
- 331 agricultural advisors trained
- More than 30000 small scale farmers reached

AIM:

- Successfully implemented fee-based advisory service in a post soviet country
- Provided consultancy services at international level, especially among former Soviet Union countries (Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Kygyzstan)

Our activities

- Ensure rural population access to demand-driven extension and information
- Increase climate change adaptive capacity of rural population and mitigation of their vulnerability
- Ensure small scale farmers better access to effective legal
- and institutional framework
- Improve farmer groups and joint work
- Increase employment opportunities of rural women and youth
- Provide agricultural publications & technical support
- Provide soil, water and feed analyses
- Support with food supply chain and marketing

Our approaches

- strengthen the demand-side for services
- promote direct contracts between farmers and advisors
- offer fee-based service delivery to farmer clients
- motivate advisors to remain functional after financial support during the training phase

Assessing fee based extension

- Paid extension from onset
- Carefull selection of trainees (on average 3 months)
- High-quality training, coaching, and encouragement
- Demand driven extension

Assessing fee based extension

- Support during training and after graduation to establish trust
- Remain with extension (no credit provision, no input supply...)
- No central (expensive) structure but independent, private advisors to keep the fees low
- Qualified and well trained coaching staff

Assessing fee based extension

- Well functioning M&E unit with a wide spread scope (trainers, farmers, AAs)
- Regular feedback from representatives of the advisors
 and stakeholders before taking major decision on changes
